Use Big Shot Embossing Mats to add more embossed texture to our crafting. Depending on the die, you can cut and emboss or you can use dies instead of embossing folders

**TIPS:** When you cut, the cutting edge of the die faces down. When you emboss, the cutting edge faces up.

The thickness of the silicone mat does not determine the depth of the embossing. Use the correct mat for each type of embossing.

## **Emboss Only**

You can emboss using most Thinlits, Framelits, and Edgelits dies. The more detailed the design the better the result

Make the embossing – only sandwich, then run the sandwich through the Big Shot

## **Cut and Emboss**

Some dies have decorative ejection holes, which leave an embossed design after the die has been run through the Big Shot using the Cut & Emboss sandwich.

1. Cut the image using the standard sandwich but keep the paper in the die.
2. Make the cut & emboss sandwich, then run the die with the paper through the Big Shot

## **Sandwiches (bottom up)**

### **Standard Sandwich**

1. Big Shot Platform + Thin Die Adaptor
2. Standard Cutting Pad
3. Single Sheet of paper
4. Die (cutting edge down)
5. Standard Cutting Pad

### **Embossing Only Sandwich**

1. Big Shot Platform
2. Standard Cutting Pad
3. Die (cutting edge UP)
4. Single Sheet of Paper
5. Thin Silicone Rubber Mat (blue)
6. Impressions Pad (white)

### **Cut & Embossing Sandwich**

1. Big Shot Platform
2. Standard Cutting Pad
3. Die with paper still in it (cutting edge up)
4. Thick silicone rubber mat (grey)
5. Impressions Pad (white)
